Making Guide

Kitchen Drawer Printmaking

Tetra Pak printing plate



1. Wash out a Tetra Pak carton.



2. Unfold the flaps and flatten.



3. Cut open the top and bottom.



4. Cut along one of the edges.



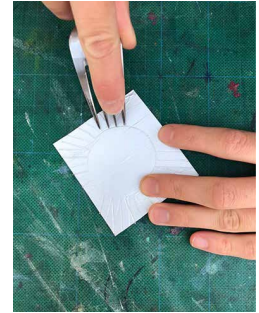
5. Fold open and dry off any water.



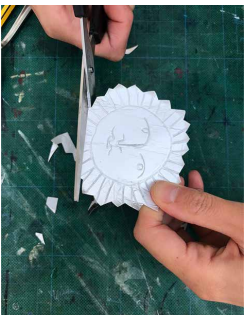
6. Cut off a small piece for a printing plate, avoid the folds and creases.



7. Draw your design using a sharp pencil, press down on all your lines so they are indented.



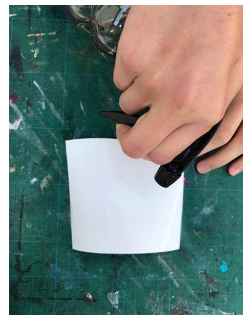
8. You could experiment drawing with other tools.



9. You could cut and shape the edges of your printing plate.



10. Colour your printing plate in with felt tip pens.



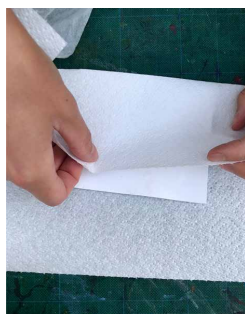
11. Prepare your paper by dampening with a water spray or sponge.



12. Wipe off excess water with a tissue.



13. Lay down a sheet of tissue, your printing plate, and the damp paper on top.



14. Fold over some of the tissue, or lay another sheet of tissue on top.



15. Apply pressure with the back of a spoon.



16. Lift up to reveal your print.
